## **Body of Christ**

- "This is the confidence that we have before him: if we ask anything according to his will, he hears us." (1 John 5:14) Author of faith, increase our faith and trust in You in the midst of our circumstances.
- Grant peace that the world cannot give, that those around us would be drawn to You.
- May many youth come to faith, grow deeply as disciples, and become leaders among Your people.
- We pray for digital missionary workers who serve in the online community, that congregational pastors would learn how to walk and work with them in this new mission field.
- We ask You to raise up effective and fruitful Christian outreach to Ottawa's large gaming culture which is mostly without church connection.

## **Family**

- Creator of marriage, lead couples newly married or preparing for marriage to treasure the marriage covenant and understand the wisdom of your ways.
- Amidst storms of uncertainty, reveal your peace to parents and children, and teach them to walk in it.
- Give parents of young adult children wisdom to know when to listen, and grace to speak words of life.
- Holy God, strengthen parents to lovingly instruct their children in Your wisdom, and children to honour their parents, that all would receive the promised blessing of a long and fruitful life.

## Media

- All-wise God, reveal the way to restored trust between news media and the public.
- Grant news coverage that gives ordinary people a voice and brings unity to our nation.
- As journalists cover transitions in government, give them wisdom to choose guests and plan stories that help audiences engage with the issues and the democratic process.

- As Ottawa Redblacks training camp begins, providing a ministry opportunity for Athletes in Action, we pray for favour on their work, and that the hearts of many players would turn to the Lord.

## Police, Fire, EMS

- Praise God for His protection over our firefighters. During several major fires in recent weeks, there were some close calls with minor injuries that could have been much worse, but no major injuries.
- Continue to ask God to protect all first responders from harm and give them wisdom for each situation.
- Pray for staffing of specialty rescue stations, and for more firefighters to receive this specialized training.
- God of healing, restore the hearts and minds of first responders who are burnt out from serving marginalized groups including the homeless. Renew their ability to serve with grace and compassion.

#### Government

- Sovereign Lord, in mercy, guide the government that will soon take office in our nation. Grant excellent communication between this new government and the city of Ottawa.
- May the 16,000 city of Ottawa employees know that Your eyes are on them and their work. Enable them to trust You for the future, and to do each day's work well and faithfully.
- Grant success to those responsible for the launch of the upcoming light rail extension.

## **Education**

- God of wisdom, grant wise counsel as high-level decisions are made for Ontario's education system.
- We ask for strong, lifegiving connections between students and staff, and healthy interactions among students, that all may find a sense of belonging in their school or campus.
- Strength of the weary, grant fresh endurance, energy and reliance on You to educators and students.
